To mark the Coronation of Their Majesties The King and Queen in May, a village party was organised in and around the Village Hall. Most funds are raised from the collecting boxes put in shops, pubs, etc.

The AGM was held on 29th September and all officers were re-elected – these are Lucinda Hutson as Chairman, Rosie Carter as Treasurer and Beryl Banester as Secretary. Frank Pope also agreed to continue as our Standard Bearer for another year. Lady Gooch also agreed to continue as our President.
